DEMONSTRATION

John Beechwood was our demonstrator. His presentation covered spiraling and texturing turnings. He covered two styles of tools; one had two wheels with sharp pattern cutters (metal workers call them knurling tools). Another is equipped with a sharp sprocket cutter that makes its pattern by being positioned diagonally to feed the tool along the tool rest. Both tools produce interesting patterns and offer a way to break up segments of turnings.

John's program was smooth and interesting and adds additional methods to our kit of options for variety with our turnings.
