Leslie Palotas, a representative of Community Vision was present to ask for our volunteer services creating presentation pieces with Oregon Coast Glassworks for persons selected as contributors to our community. The pieces, consisting of glass floats in turned wooden bases, will create an artistic arrangement for 12 trophies. Windfall pieces of Sitka spruce from Oregon Coast Community Forest Association will be available at Hasting Coastal Woodworks. The spruce can be seen as a still-living tree from a Forest Hill trail. Ideally we'll have the glass floats ready before mid-January and the bases completed by February 12th. Nominations are open for those who have helped the Greater Newport Area Community in 2020.
